Terry and her husband, Peter, would like to welcome you to Abingdon and their non-smoking home - which many guests comment has a friendly 'home from home' atmosphere. The house is set back from the main road on a service road with many trees providing an effective sound barrier and is 0.9 miles from the centre of Abingdon. There are 5 en-suite bedrooms including one ground floor 'easy mobility' twin roomed suite.

From the time of arrival, with seven marked out spaces to park and a very short ramped (1:14) access to the house, we will do everything we can to ensure that your stay is comfortable and that all reasonable requests are met.



The ground floor room is light and airy. Although the doorway into the bedroom is 820mm wide, the tight turning circle into the bedroom may restrict any wheelchair that has leg extensions. An emergency pull cord is alongside one bed and the toilet. The en-suite all level-floor 'wet-room' has space for left hand side transfer to the toilet and right hand side transfer to the shower seat.

All rooms have digital Freeview DVD/TV, tea/coffee making facilities, hairdryer, iron/ironing board, small personal security safe as well as free WiFi Internet access. The guest lounge/breakfast room is on the same level as the 'easy mobility' suite.



A bedrail is available if required.

Bookings can be made by telephone, email, or direct via the website where real-time availability can always be checked. All major debit and credit cards are accepted but it is regretted that cheques are no longer acceptable. Please call to discuss any other requirements, including special diets.

For travel into Oxford by bus (6 miles), the distance from the front door to the nearest bus stop by wheelchair is 43 metres (with one 13 cm and one 3 cm step to negotiate). The X3 and X13 service to Oxford is operated by the Oxford Bus Company and their buses have the facility to 'kneel' to enable wheelchair users to get on board. The journey into Oxford by bus takes around 20 minutes and most days of the week the service runs every 5-10 minutes. (Please be aware that Oxford does not welcome cars and encourages visitors to use buses or their 'Park & Ride' facility.) There are also buses to Culham, Didcot, Marcham, Milton Park, etc. from the bus stop across the road.
